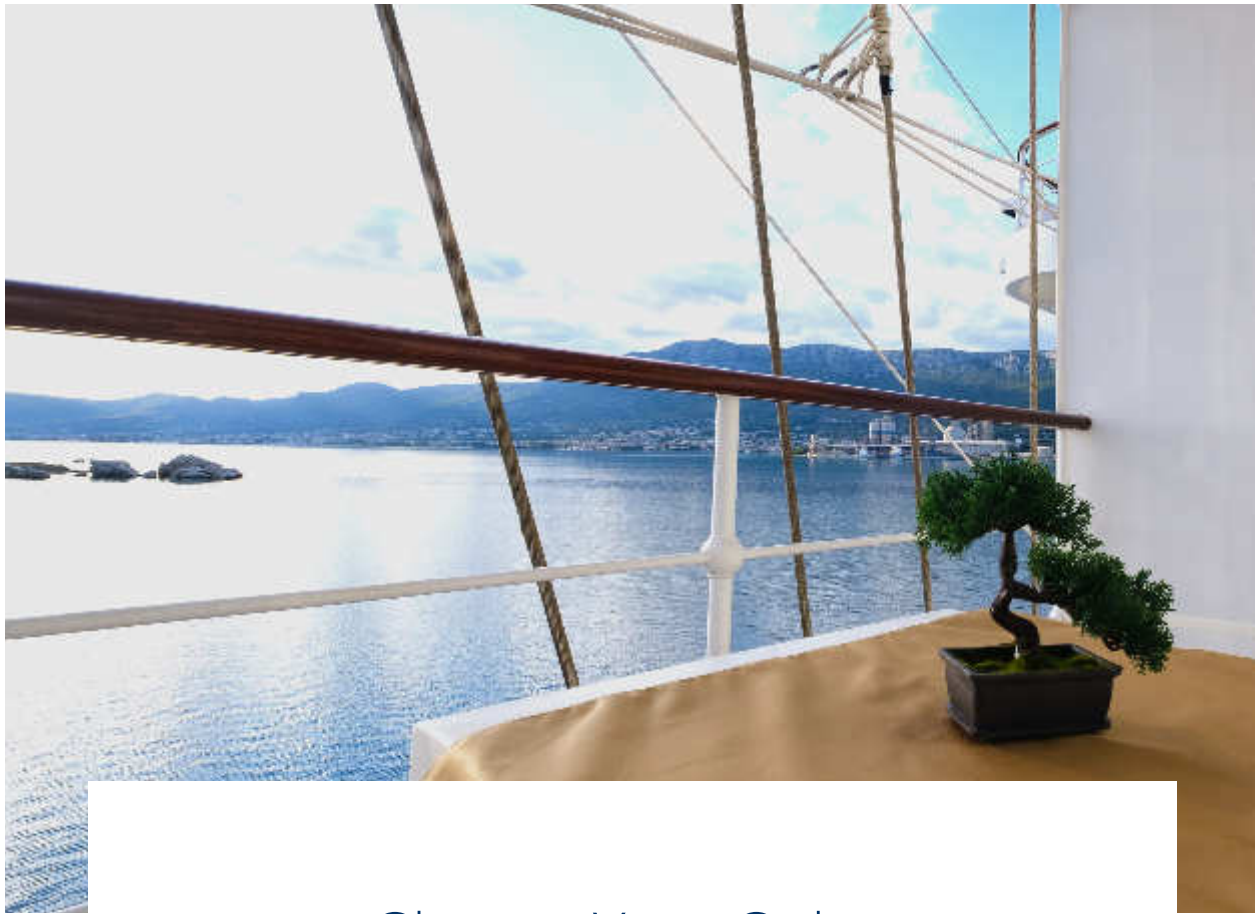

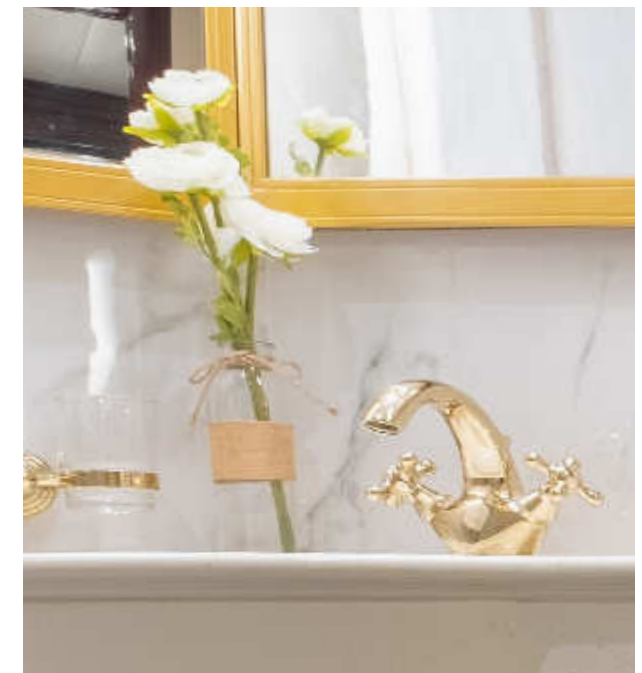


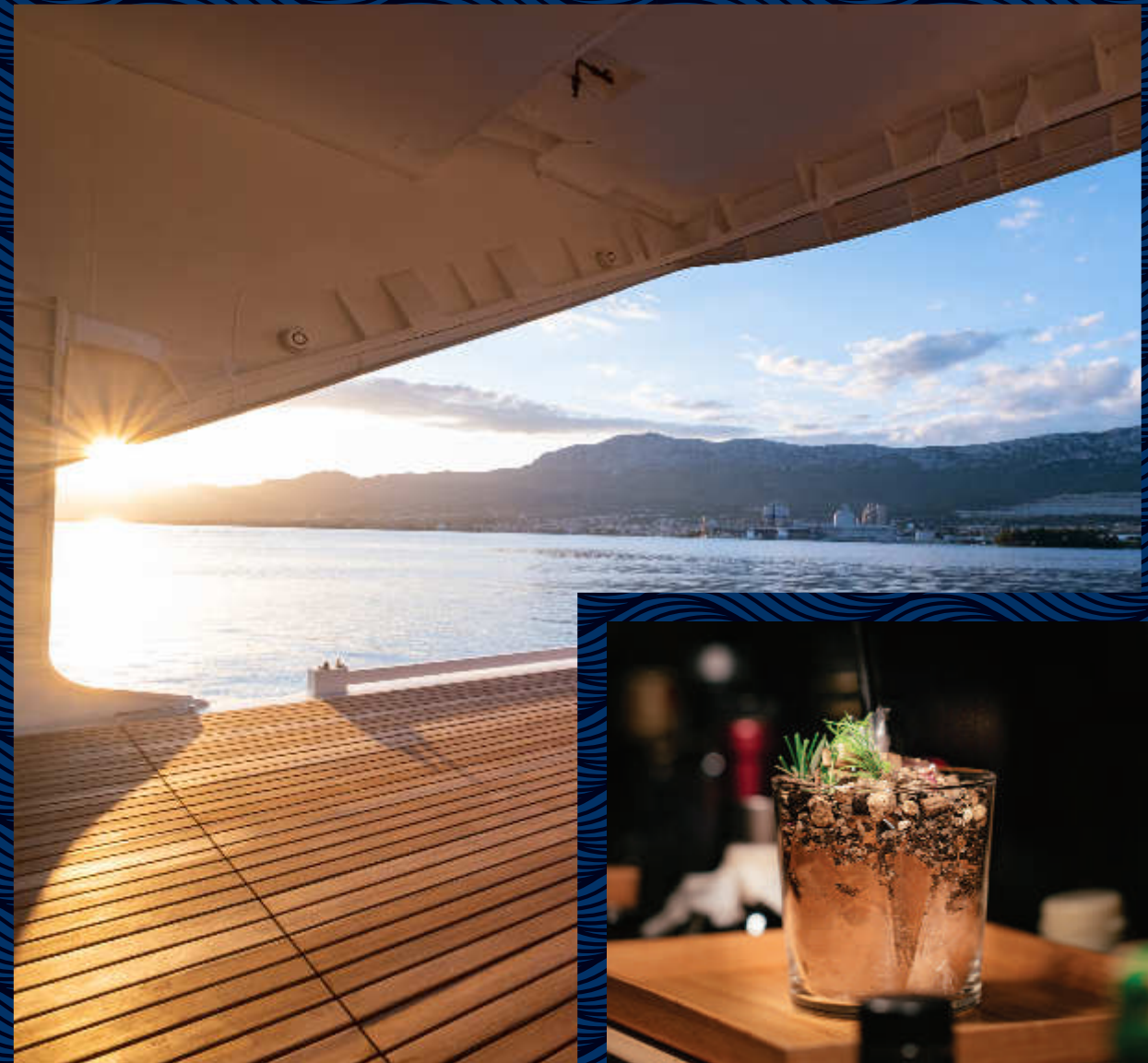

Morning

There's time for a sauna and a hammam at sea, or a lazy afternoon watching a movie. You can also retreat to a sunbed (or the library) to enjoy a good book and the chance of an afternoon snooze.

Evening

Kick off the evening with cocktail hour, listening to dramatic music while the sails billow and lift the ship from the sea just a little.

Have a drink at the Piano Bar and decide where the evening will take you – watching the game show at the Horizon Bar, perhaps, or chatting to new friends over a whisky at Debeljak's Bar. You can enjoy a delicious meal in the Dining Room, dance to the sound of our talented musicians or opt for a night under the stars, learning about

the night sky during a star-gazing lecture. If you'd like to pre-order breakfast to be delivered to your cabin in the morning. We highly recommend tucking into Eggs Benedict while soaking up the ocean views from your balcony.

Eastern Coastal Contrasts

01 July, 2021 ~ 5 Nights ~ Calling at **Harwich**, Whitby, Newcastle, Berwick Upon Tweed, **Leith**.

Be part of history as one of the first guests onboard Golden Horizon on her inaugural voyage, sailing from Harwich to Leith, taking in picturesque coastal towns along the way.



Sailing from Harwich, we'll spend a day at sea before arriving in bustling Whitby, Yorkshire. Home to a busy commercial port also used for fishing, the town is brimming with great seafood. Traditional fish and chips rarely gets better than in Whitby. Tour the ruined 7th-century Whitby Abbey before heading along the coast to quaint Robin Hood's Bay, or head inland and hike through the North York Moors National Park.

Our next stop is Newcastle, an enthralling city with an industrial past that today has a thriving art scene in its small galleries and a host of brilliant restaurants. From here, you might head into the

small town of Corbridge to shop in its boutiques and visit the ruined Roman town that sits on Hadrian's Wall – the frontier of the Roman Empire in then Britannia.

At Berwick-upon-Tweed, right by the Scottish border, you could scale the ruins of its castle or enjoy some beach time on the nearby sandy swathes, before we end our voyage in Leith – the gateway to Edinburgh. Make time to visit the castle and medieval Royal Mile, and don't miss out on a taste of classic Scottish neeps and tatties in one of the old fashioned pubs.

Scotland East to West

06 Jul, 2021 ~ 9 Nights

Calling at **Leith**, Aberdeen, Invergordon, Scapa Flow, Ullapool, Portree, Tobermory, Fort William, Port Ellen (Islay), **Greenock (Glasgow)**

Experience the highlights of Scotland in style, with visits to historic castles, glistening lochs and towering mountains.

Sailing from Leith, where you'll have had the chance to explore some of Edinburgh's top attractions, we make our way north, across the Firth of Forth and onto Aberdeen. Visit the Maritime Museum and Aberdeen Art Gallery, or take a day to hike in the Cairngorms National Park, the largest nature preserve in Scotland, where mountains and country estates – including Her Majesty's Balmoral Castle – are ten-a-penny.

Next up is Invergordon, the gateway to Loch Ness, and then we'll cruise around Scapa Flow, where the wild and remote Orkney Islands are stranded off the coast of mainland Scotland. Ullapool is where we'll explore the rugged landscapes of Corrieshalloch Gorge or Knockan Crag, before we land on the Isle of Skye. Visit the otherworldly Fairy Glen and see the striking Man of Storr, and don't miss a taste of local Talisker whisky.

A stop in Tobermory offers clan history at Duart Castle, and Fort William is your jumping off point for adventures around towering Ben Nevis. You can taste whisky in Islay – Scotland's best island for smoky malts – and finish up in Greenock, where you can strike out into Glasgow to taste your way around the city's fantastic food scene.





West Coast Gems of Scotland

15 Jul, 2021 ~ 6 Nights ~ Calling at **Greenock (Glasgow)**, Tobermory, Stornoway, Ullapool, Portree, Port Ellen (Islay), **Greenock (Glasgow)**

Discover the beautiful coastal towns of Western Scotland, taking in striking natural sights, historic castles and glistening lochs along the way.

Cruise over to the Isle of Mull, docking in its colourful capital where an unmistakable row of painted houses offers a bright welcome. Here, you'll get to tour Duart Castle for a window on the historic clans of Scotland, or enjoy a scenic cruise on the Sound of Mull where dolphins and minke whales swim in the waters.

Stornoway is the next stop, where guests can explore the castle or see some Neolithic standing stones. You can take in Corrieshalloch Gorge and its rushing waterfalls in Ullapool, or you could opt to hike the dramatic, ancient landscapes of Knockan Crag. Docking in Portree, we'll head out to explore the island's lofty landscapes. The rich-green foliage and unusual rock formations of the Fairy Glen are simply otherworldly. Sip single malts in Islay – Scotland's whisky isle – and meet the hen harriers of Loch Gruinart nature reserve, before we finally dock back in Glasgow to finish our voyage.

Maritime Cities of the North West

21 Jul, 2021 ~ 4 Nights ~ Calling at **Greenock (Glasgow)**, Portrush, Belfast, **Liverpool**.

Join us on our journey along the North West coast, as we take in picturesque Portrush and Belfast before sailing into Liverpool.

Our voyage begins in Greenock, the closest port of call for Glasgow. Scotland's second city is a dynamic, artistic hub. From the small seaside town of Portrush you can enjoy a visit to the Giant's Causeway, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. With an expert ranger guide, immerse yourself in the history of the causeway's 40,000 basalt columns. Or join our whisky on the rocks experience with a Bushmills Whisky expert.

In Belfast – our next stop – maritime history abounds. The Titanic Quarter is home to the Titanic Museum, too, a fascinating multimedia exhibition packed with moving stories. Also don't miss the Ulster Museum, the chilling Crumlin Road Gaol and the Victorian St George's Market. Finally, we'll dock in Liverpool where Beatles history runs through the city's streets, and the Royal Albert Dock hosts a handful of excellent museums.



Rounding the South West Peninsula

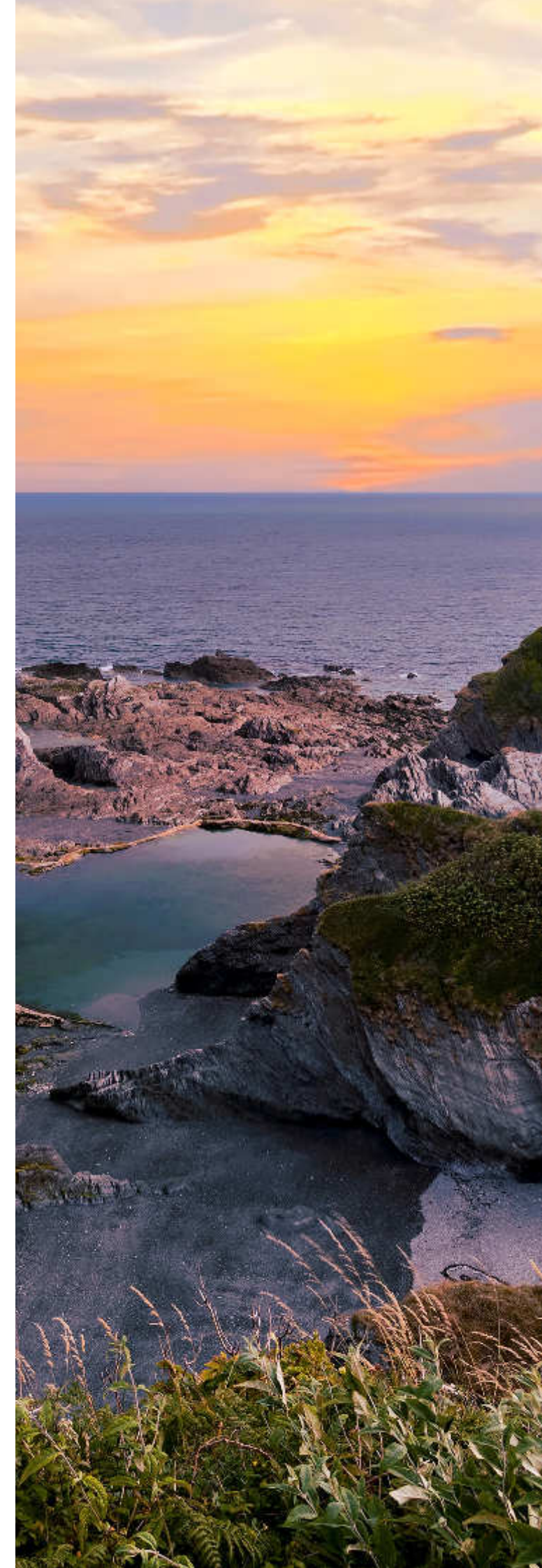
25 Jul, 2021 ~ 10 Nights ~ Calling at **Liverpool**, Douglas (Isle of Man), Holyhead, Fishguard, Ilfracombe, St Mary's (Isles of Scilly), Dartmouth, Lyme Regis, Poole, **Harwich**

Sail around the Isle of Man, England and Isles of Scilly, taking in charming cities, beautiful gardens and sandy beaches.

Our journey begins from Liverpool, an important maritime city for Britain and the home of the world's most famous music group, the Beatles. We'll make our way to the Isle of Man overnight, docking in the capital, Douglas. Come morning, here, you can ride the mountain railway for fantastic views over to Britain, or take to the world-famous TT circuit on a Trike.

Next up is Holyhead, where you can disembark to explore the island of Anglesey. Venture into the magnificent Snowdonia National Park or take a bracing walk in Breakwater Country Park. Fishguard is the gateway to the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, where dark, dramatic cliffs overlook the wild Atlantic Ocean, and then we'll sail on to north Devon to enjoy the sparkling sandy beaches around Ilfracombe.

The Isles of Scilly, with their balmy microclimate, fascinating gardens and wild coastal paths, are the next stop, and then it's onto Dartmouth where you can walk along the shores of Slapton Ley lake or take the local steam railway. You'll get to see prehistoric parts of the Jurassic Coast as we stop in Lyme Regis, then visit Brownsea Island when Golden Horizon will dock in Poole. Finally, a day at sea takes us to our end point of Harwich where we bid farewell.



English South Coast and Islands

04 Aug, 2021 ~ 10 Nights ~ Calling at **Harwich**, Cowes, Dartmouth, Falmouth, St Mary's, Plymouth, Poole, **Harwich**

This special voyage visits the Isle of Wight during Cowes Week – the world's oldest and largest annual sailing regatta. For sailing fans, this is a one-of-a-kind experience. Cowes Week dates back to 1826, and today around 8,000 competitors participate in the eight-day event. It's a remarkable way to see world-class sailing action, with champion yachtsmen and sailing enthusiasts all taking to the water. As well as watching the action unfold, we'll have an exclusive opportunity to join the celebrations, which include a dazzling firework display.

While on the Isle of Wight, we recommend sampling the afternoon tea at Northwood House Country Manor. There's the option of a high-speed RIB ride or, for a taste of British culture, you could visit the home of Victorian poet, Lord Tennyson, at Farringford House. We then sails on to Dartmouth, with its wild moorlands and river valleys.

In Falmouth, wander around the harbour's quaint galleries and quirky shops offering woolly hats, Cornish pasties and sweet homemade fudge. From Falmouth, it's around an hour to the Eden Project's giant geodesic Biomes; or visit Tintagel and Land's End. We cross the ocean to the Isles of Scilly to discover local markets, National Maritime treasures and white-sand beaches.

In Plymouth, soak up the vibe of Britain's Ocean City by following the famous Mayflower Steps, where the Pilgrims are believed to have left England onboard the Mayflower. We'll spend time in Poole, discovering its wildlife-rich islands, waterfront restaurants and Blue Flag beaches, before setting sail back to Harwich.

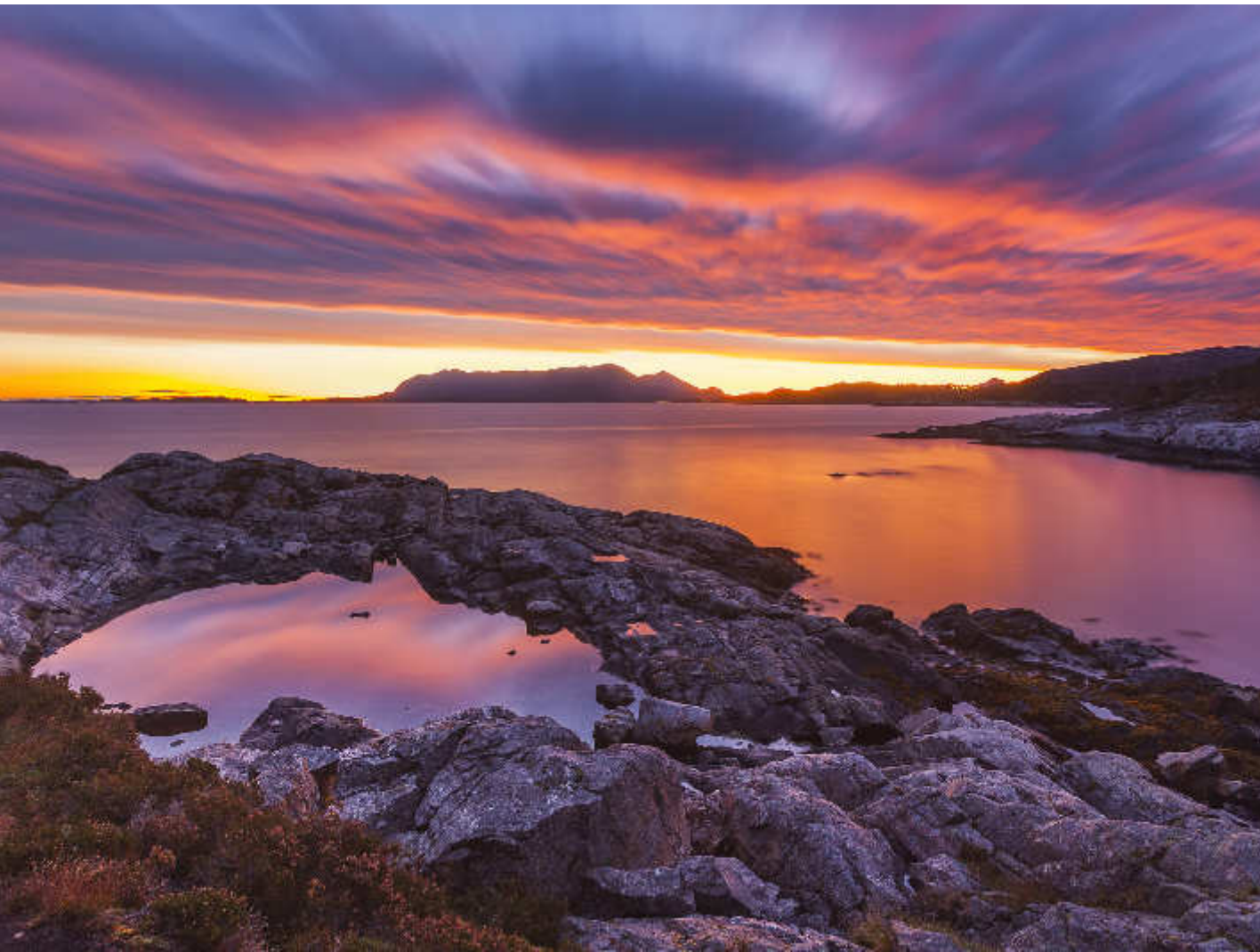


Norwegian Fjords Adventure

14 Aug, 2021 ~ 7 Nights

Calling at **Harwich**, Stavanger, Hardangerfjord, Odda, Rosendal, **Harwich**

Our Norwegian Fjords Adventure is packed with stunning natural scenery and adventures out on the water.



On land, explore Old Stavanger with its 18th-century white wooden houses, cobbled streets, galleries and craft shops. There's also the chance to hike to Pulpit Rock – the most famous lookout point in Norway, which drops 600 metres down a sheer cliff face into the Lysefjord. You'll also get to spend a marina day at Odda, where you can take the chance to admire

the stunning natural beauty of the fjord on a RIB ride excursion or take a sea kayak out and see how much wildlife you can spot.

Beautiful Denmark

21 Aug, 2021 ~ 7 Nights

Calling at **Harwich**, Skagen, Aalborg, Copenhagen, Frederikshavn, **Harwich**

Uncover Denmark's history, fairytale magic and mouth-watering food on this unforgettable tall ship voyage.

In Aalborg, you can step back in time as you explore this 15th-century city's cobbled streets, colourful crooked houses and cosy cafés, before venturing to see the effects of Europe's largest moving sand dune from the port of Skagen.

Trendy Copenhagen is a city of castles, canals and palaces. It's easy to explore on foot, so discover the pretty canal-side houses in Nyhavn and head to the waterside to view the famous bronze statue of the Little Mermaid. A must-visit is charming Tivoli Gardens – the magical place that inspired Walt Disney to create Disneyland.

Copenhagen also has world-class food; we recommend trying the famous Danish pastries. The city hosts the annual Copenhagen Cooking & Food Festival in August, where restaurants and gastronomers join forces to celebrate the city's food scene and impress visiting foodies.

Shore Experiences

UK & Ireland



Holyhead

The port of Holyhead is the busiest UK Irish ferry port and is home to the largest seagoing ferry in the World. There are excellent coastal walks at the Breakwater Country Park, these include audio trails, a new open gallery within the old brick shed, and themed walks.



Belfast

Northern Ireland's capital offers a great mix of sightseeing. In the city, there's Belfast Castle, the city hall and the botanical gardens, as well as lots of great restaurants and pubs. Outside of the city, you can explore Game of Thrones filming locations and head out to the impressive Giant's Causeway to follow in the footsteps of giants.



Whitby

Whitby is a seaside town in Yorkshire, split by the River Esk. On the East Cliff, overlooking the North Sea, the ruined Gothic Whitby Abbey was Bram Stoker's inspiration for "Dracula". Nearby is the Church of St. Mary, reached by 199 steps. The Captain Cook Memorial Museum, in the house where Cook once lived, displays paintings and maps.



Portree

This main town on the Isle of Skye in the Inner Hebrides has a thriving cultural centre and is a popular base for exploring the rest of the island. Visitors are drawn to the spectacular scenery including the landscapes that surround Eilean Donon Castle and the dramatic Kilt Rock which looks strikingly similar to a pleated kilt!

UK

Port Ellen, Islay

A small town on the island of Islay, in Argyll, Scotland. Arriving by ship it is impossible to miss the square shaped Carraig Fhada Lighthouse and its bay of golden sand. The island is best known for its whisky distilleries and you'll have the chance for a wee dram.



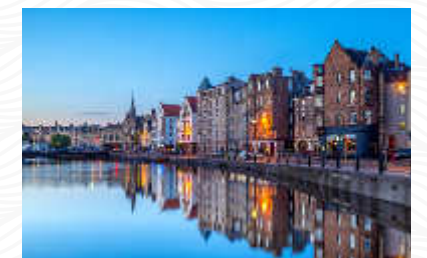
Stornoway

Stornoway is the main town of the Western Isles and the capital of Lewis and Harris in Scotland. It has a bustling harbour and waterfront with museums, art galleries all overlooked by Lews Castle. Further afield you'll find mills and cottages where Harris Tweed is woven.



Leith

Resting at the mouth of the Water of Leith, this buzzing port district is home to hip creatives, long time locals and one of the world's most famous ships - the Royal Yacht Britannia. Should you wish to venture into Edinburgh, there is enough time for you to visit the castle and climb Arthur's seat.



Scapa Flow

Scapa Flow is a body of water in the Orkney Islands. These sheltered waters have played an important role in travel, trade and conflict through the centuries. Neolithic ancient remains can be found at Orkney's UNESCO world heritage site and the capital of Orkney, Kirkwall, is an interesting place to visit.



Shore Experiences UK



Fort William

Sitting in the shadow of the mighty Ben Nevis and located in the Scottish Highlands, Fort William is often described as the outdoor capital of the UK. Taste the local delicacy of red herring known as smooth Scmalts, hike to the cascading Steall Falls and admire the UK's highest peak.



Newcastle

A diverse city which was a major shipbuilding and manufacturing hub during the industrial revolution and now a centre of business, arts, and sciences. This charming city is bursting with a thriving nightlife, award-winning restaurants, and great museums. It is also the starting point for excursions to Hadrian's wall, a UNESCO world heritage site.



Poole

A coastal town known for its large natural harbour and sandy beaches. The Old Town has Georgian houses and Poole Museum, which explores local history. From Poole Harbour, boats head south to Brownsea Island. This wooded area has trails and wildlife such as red squirrels, plus 16th-century Brownsea Castle, now a private hotel.



Lyme Regis

Sometimes dubbed the "Pearl of Dorset", it lies on Lyme Bay on the English Channel coast at the Dorset-Devon border. An atmospheric coastal town with pretty georgian streets, ancient harbour. No trip to Lyme Regis would be complete without fossil hunting, and the Lyme Regis Museum. The Cobb Harbour, full of history, romance and scenery.

Norway & Denmark

Stavanger

Easy city to discover on foot - Stop by some of the city's many museums including the Norwegian Petroleum Museum. Stavanger has long claimed to be the cradle of the Vikings and it has Norway's only preserved medieval abbey and was a royal estate for many Viking kings. Here you will marvel at one of Norway's spectacular wonders, The Pulpit Rock.



Odda

A small village situated innermost in Sørfjorden, an arm of the beautiful Hardangerfjord. Odda lies right by the Folgefonna glacier and nearby is the mountain village Røldal, the "power" village Tyssedal and the hamlet Skare - all different and distinctive areas. Hardangervidda National park, for wildlife spotting of wild deer, arctic fox and golden eagle.



Copenhagen

Cool and colourful Copenhagen has a strong royal history. Amalienborg Palace is still home to the Danish Royal Family. 400-year-old Rosenborg Castle showcases more royal regalia, including the coronation throne and crown jewels. Enjoy a traditional Danish pastry during your time here and take the chance to explore the city by bike.



Skagen

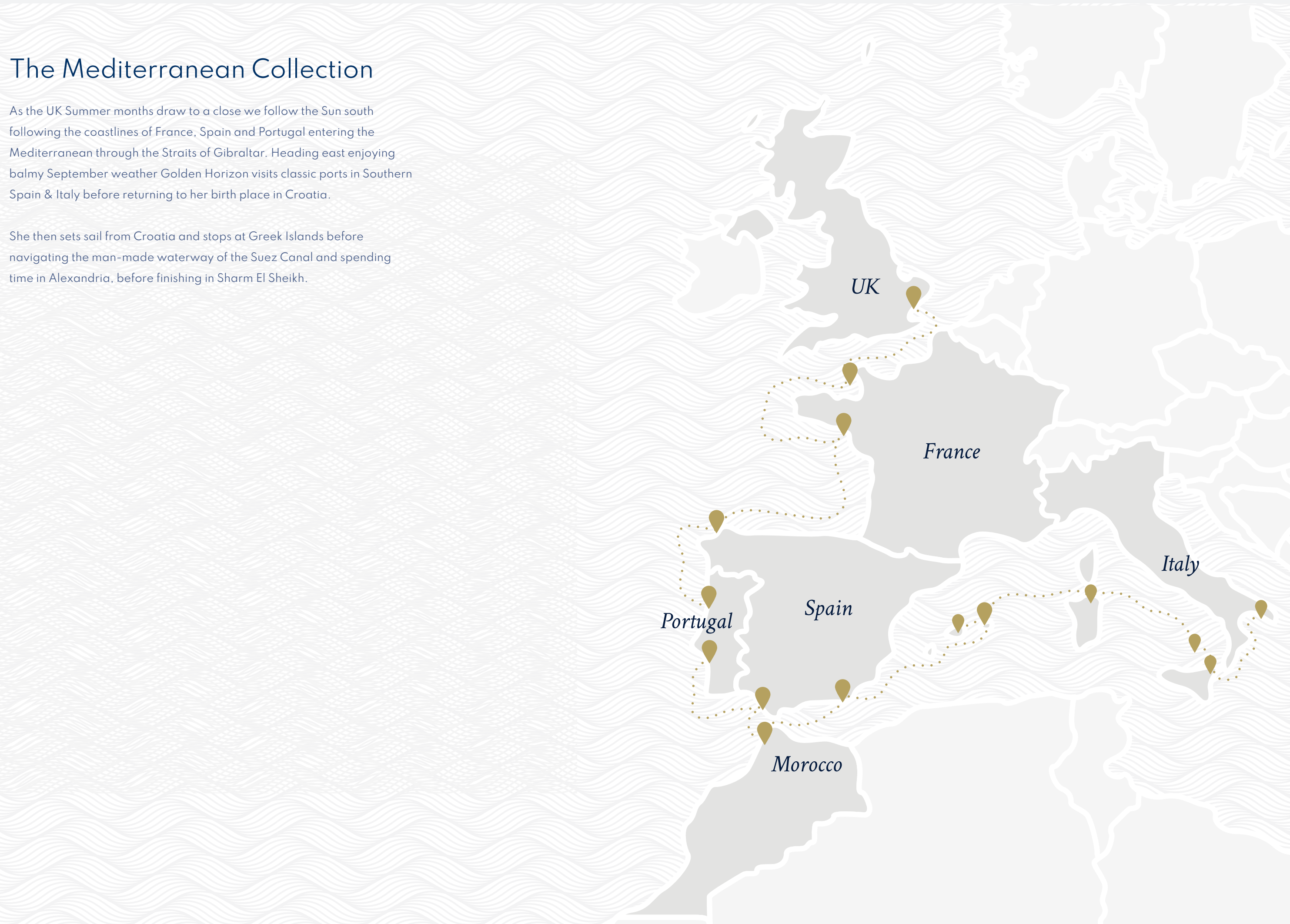
As the northernmost town in Denmark this renowned town has amazing light and landscape which inspired many Skagen painters. These works can be found in Skagen's museum and for a taste of the port's heritage head to the former courthouse. Escape to the outskirts and capture the views of the seas of Skagerrak and Kattegatmeet.



The Mediterranean Collection

As the UK Summer months draw to a close we follow the Sun south following the coastlines of France, Spain and Portugal entering the Mediterranean through the Straits of Gibraltar. Heading east enjoying balmy September weather Golden Horizon visits classic ports in Southern Spain & Italy before returning to her birth place in Croatia.

She then sets sail from Croatia and stops at Greek Islands before navigating the man-made waterway of the Suez Canal and spending time in Alexandria, before finishing in Sharm El Sheikh.





Iberian Delights

28 Aug, 2021 ~ 10 Nights

Calling at **Harwich**, St Helier, L'Orient, La Coruña, Vigo, Leixões, **Lisbon**

This scenic voyage takes us to the island of Jersey and around the south-west coast of Europe.

Jersey's capital, St Helier, has a beautiful sweeping bay and a yacht-studded marina that hosts the annual Jersey Boat Show, while over in France, the maritime town of Lorient is home to a World War II submarine base and is the gateway to charming towns and medieval castles. Our chosen stop in Spain is La Coruña, known for its ancient Roman lighthouse, the Tower of Hercules, which has breathtaking coastal views. We then sail to Leixões for Portugal's second largest city, Porto, with its stately bridges and colourful houses. Wander the cobbled streets of charming Ribeira, visit opulent São Francisco Church and sample the excellent port wine.



Southern Spain & Morocco Explorer

7 Sept, 2021 ~ 7 Nights

Calling at **Lisbon**, Cadiz, Tangier, Almeria, Mahon, **Palma**

Sail along Spain's southern coastline, exploring castles, cathedrals, harbours and islands.

Cadiz is thought to be the oldest inhabited city in Europe and has a long naval history. Home of the Spanish Navy, it has more than 100 watchtowers – head to the top of the Torre Tavira for views out over the city. There's also the opportunity to see the 18th-century Cadiz Cathedral, take a trip to Jerez de la Frontera (the sherry capital of Andalusia) and learn the art of flamenco dancing. Step ashore in Morocco to experience the highlights of Tangier, including its vibrant hillside medina, the part natural/part man-made Cave of Hercules and a Moroccan staple: mint tea. Back in Spain, we'll visit Almeria with its huge Alcazaba of Almeria citadel and rustic coastal views, then take in the colourful colonial buildings of Menorca's capital, Mahon.

Italian Discovery

Calling at **Palma**, Olbia, Sorrento, Lipari, Messina, Dubrovnik, **Split**

Our Italy voyage combines famous historical sites, dazzling beaches and idyllic coastal towns.

It's a breathtaking journey right from the start as we sail Sardinia's bright turquoise waters to Olbia and the long sandy beaches of Costa Smeralda. It's then on to the mainland and the city of Naples. With its ancient cultural attractions, delicious food and views of Mount Vesuvius, Naples is fascinating enough on its own, but from this storied city you can also travel to the pretty towns of Sorrento, Positano and Amalfi, or visit the remarkable UNESCO World Heritage Site of Pompeii. More historical attractions await in Messina, including the cathedral and Fountain of Neptune with its huge marble monument of the sea god. After all that exploring, adventure awaits in the city of Dubrovnik.

In Egypt, we spend time in Alexandria, giving you the chance to add on our Cairo experience, a must-do if you want to see the colossal Pyramids of Giza. We then navigate the man-made waterway of the Suez Canal and head to Safaga, known for being a great destination for windsurfing and diving with beautiful turquoise waters and some excellent offshore reefs. The voyage then ends in Sharm el Sheikh, another desintation know for its incredible diving and beaches.

L'orient

A Brittany town and seaport with an abundance of heritage and landscapes. Lorient played a huge role in the Second World War and was a primary target for Allied bombing raids. In the city today you'll find a rebuilt city with museums and galleries to explore, and Port Louis across the bay.



La Coruna

A port city nestled in the Galicia region of northwest Spain. It is well known for the Tower of Hercules, a Roman Lighthouse where you can capture sweeping coastal views. In the centre you'll find a city of contrasts from the narrow lanes of the medieval old town to the modern cultural centre with a fine dining scene.



Cádiz

On the waterfront is the domed, 18th-century Cádiz Cathedral, featuring baroque and neoclassical elements. Plaza de España and the Town Hall. Home of the Spanish Navy, it has more than 100 watchtowers – head to the top of the Torre Tavira for views out over the city.



Almeria

Almería is a city in southeast Spain. The Alcazaba is an imposing Moorish fortress overlooking the city. The fortified, 16th-century Almería Cathedral has a Gothic ribbed ceiling. The Museum of Almería displays archaeological finds from across the region.

Messina

A harbour city which sits in the northeast corner of Sicily separated from mainland Italy by the narrow Straits of Messina. This ancient seaport is home to the Norman Messina Cathedral and the Fountain of Neptune. It is the base for excursions to Mount Etna and the hillside town of Taormina.



Dubrovnik

Fronting the Adriatic Sea this southern Croatian city is known for its distinctive medieval Old Town. The well-preserved stone walls were completed in the 16th century and are worth a visit. Explore the old stone buildings, walk along the limestone streets and admire the shimmer of the Adriatic.



Alexandria

The city was a major centre of civilisations in the ancient world and has continued throughout its long history to act as a vital crossing point for merchants and their trade on the maritime routes between Asia and Europe. This port is a great base to travel further afield, visiting a wonder of the ancient world, the Pyramids of Giza.



Safaga

This port town is located on the coast of the Red Sea, 53km south of Hurgada. It is a great destination for windsurfing and diving with beautiful turquoise waters and some excellent offshore reefs. It's a great base for excursions to the historically rich city of Luxor.

Starting our journey in Split, we'll sail the Dalmatian coast of Croatia to Bol on Brač Island. This little isle is characterised by its white stone houses in the main town, a hilly interior and a world-famous beach – the pebbly Zlatni Rat. Spend a day here exploring the hills on foot or enjoying the pristine waters before we sail on to Hvar. Here you'll enjoy touring its pretty harbour town or the vineyards of the interior, as well as relaxing in its secluded coves.

Back in Croatia, we'll visit Korčula for more beach time and Vis, the remotest and least developed of the country's islands.

Sailing away from beguiling Venice, we'll make our first stop in the city of Rovinj – a beautiful fishing port on the Istrian Peninsula. Explore its cobblestone streets and pretty ancient churches, or head along the coast to the forested natural park where secluded beaches and relaxed bars hide away in coves. Our next stop is Pula, where guests can seek out the vast amphitheatre or head out to the beaches on the Verudela Peninsula nearby.

We'll stop at Losinj – where over 1100 plant species thrive inland and dolphins can often be spotted in the surrounding waters. Next up is Zadar, where we'll overnight allowing for plenty of time to explore the city. You'll have the chance to explore the Kornati Islands, where 140-isles make up a protected national park with gorgeous reefs and bright white rock formations on land, and then visit Vis – the most remote of Croatia's islands.

Bol, Brač Island

Bol is a town on the Croatian island of Brač, off the coast of Split. Its seafront promenade leads to the long, pebble Zlatni Rat beach. To the west, the Dragon's Cave contains a 15th-century chapel with carved wall details. Or visit more of the island and explore the cobbled streets of Supetar and taste the island's local olive oil.



Hvar

Highlights of this port town include its 13th-century walls, a hilltop fortress and a main square anchored by the Renaissance-era Hvar Cathedral. The island also features beaches and inland lavender fields. Capture some of Hvar's beautiful valleys and picturesque bays in a 4x4 or visit one of the family-owned wineries to sample some of the wonderful wines of Croatia.



Zadar

Known for the Roman and Venetian ruins of its Old Town. Surrounding the Roman-era Forum is 11th-century St. Mary's Convent, with religious art dating to the 8th century. Discover the beauty of the Zrmanja River area on an exciting off-road experience in a 4x4 or venture to Krka National Park known for its beautiful cascading waterfalls.



Vis

In Vis town, parts of the ancient city walls remain, along with a thermae (public bath). Levaman Fortress houses the Archaeological Museum, with exhibits including a 4th-century-B.C. bronze head of the goddess Artemis and amphorae recovered offshore. On a small peninsula, St. Jerome's Church and Monastery is built over an ancient Roman theater.

Rovinj

Rovinj is a Croatian fishing port on the west coast of the Istrian peninsula, a very pretty small town with romantic charm and glorious sunsets. A tangle of cobbled streets leads to the hilltop church of St. Euphemia, whose towering steeple dominates the skyline. South of the old town is Lone Bay, one of the area's pebble beaches.



Losinj

Losinj - This island has a small population of about 150 who speak their own dialect, which is not easily understood by other Croats. It is also distinct because the women often dress in colourful costume, comprising of a short, multicoloured dress, white blouse and red leggings.



Kotor

Montenegro is characterized by winding streets and squares, stroll through a maze of tiny alleys, with a gorgeous medieval old walled city with world heritage status. A delightful walking tour of Kotor will bring you closer to the history of this medieval city or join a small group and climb the imposing city walls of Kotor. It's also home to the Maritime Museum, which explores local seafaring history.



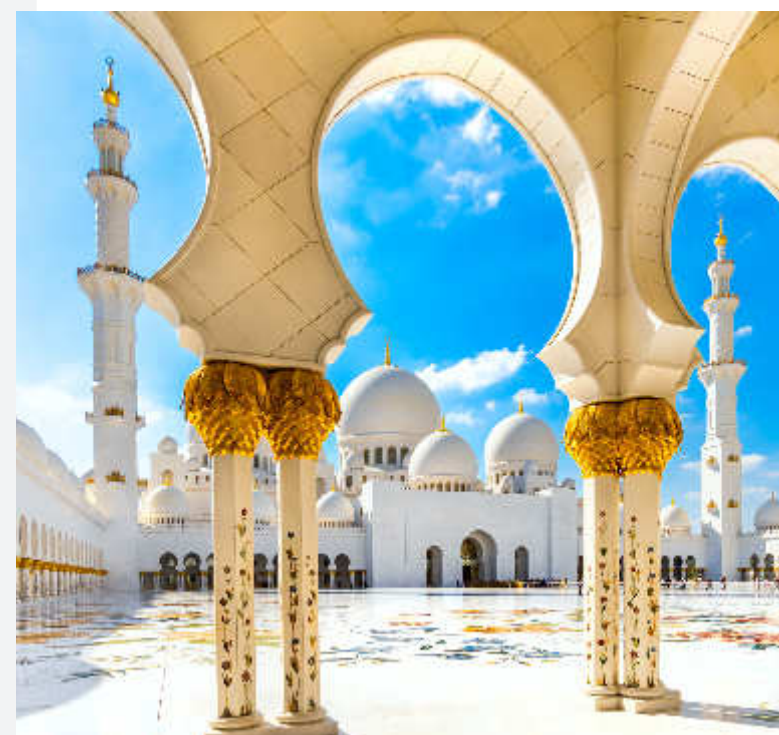
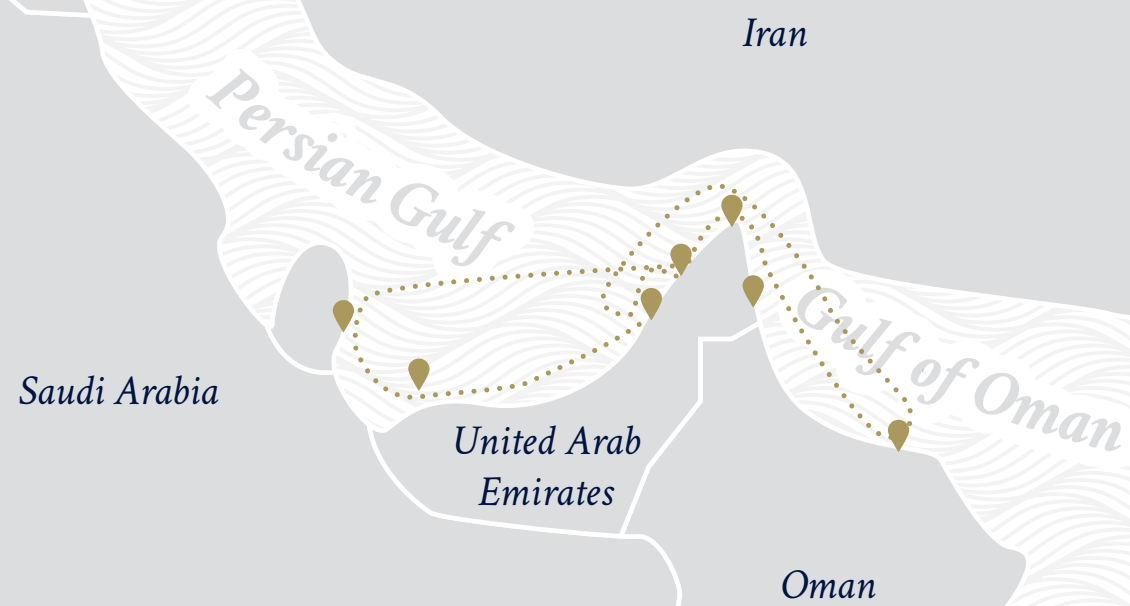
Korčula

The sixth largest island in Croatia, Korčula is 20 miles long and rather narrow, between 4 and 5 miles wide on average. Korčula is an island of impressive landmarks, quaint villages and lush vineyards. You'll discover numerous maritime villages built around inviting coves and along steep hillsides with exotic names like Smokvica, Pupnat and Blato.

Doha

Doha offers a mix of modern and ancient - with a sparkling skyline which emphasises the display of the country's vast oil wealth that has transformed this city from a fishing and pearl diving town to a cosmopolitan city. Take in the site of the Imam Muhammad Ibn Ab Al Wahhab Mosque - a spectacular structure and can capture great views of the city and take a walk along the La Corniche, the seafront promenade.



Sir Bani Yas

Sir Bani Yas Island is dominated by the Arabian Wildlife Park, with its roaming giraffes, cheetahs and gazelles. Multiple archaeological sites across the island include the ruins of an ancient Christian monastery. The coast features beaches, sea kayak routes and a shipwreck. The late Sheikh Zayed bin Al Nahyan was a visionary who transformed Sir Bani Yas Island into an ecosystem that is currently home to approximately 16,000 animals. Endangered species roam freely in this natural environment.



Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates, sits off the mainland on an island in the Persian (Arabian) Gulf. Its focus on oil exports and commerce is reflected by the skyline's modern towers and shopping megacenters such as Abu Dhabi and Marina malls. Beneath white-marble domes, the vast Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque features an immense Persian carpet, crystal chandeliers and capacity for 41,000 worshippers.

Khasab, Oman

Khasab Fort has crenellated stone turrets, model wooden boats and a museum with handicrafts and archaeological finds. From Khasab Harbor, wooden boats cruise the Strait of Hormuz, offering rugged coastal views and dolphin sightings. It's rugged and mountainous, real moonscape destination known for its fjords and dirt road 4X4 high mountain drives affording incredible vistas.



Muscat, Oman

Muscat, Oman's port capital, sits on the Gulf of Oman surrounded by mountains and desert. With history dating back to antiquity, it mixes high-rises and upscale shopping malls with clifftop landmarks such as the 16th-century Portuguese forts, Al Jalali and Mirani, looming over Muscat Harbor. Its modern, marble-clad Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, with 50m dome and prodigious Persian carpet, can accommodate 20,000 people.



Fujairah

Fujairah is an emirate on the east coast of the United Arab Emirates, lying along the Gulf of Oman. It's known for its beaches and the Hajar Mountains, which run through much of the emirate. In the south, the city of Fujairah is home to the massive Sheikh Zayed Mosque, with its towering white minarets. Overlooking the city is Fujairah Fort, a reconstructed 17th-century fortress featuring round and square tower.

Nearby, sail out to lagoons to dive with sea turtles, or simply stay in the city to enjoy its many museums.

A journey from Singapore to Bali, taking in the beautiful beaches and turquoise waters of North Belitung, the Karimunjawa Islands archipelago and more...



Starting our journey in Singapore – we’ll first sail to North Belitung in Indonesia. This island has some of the prettiest beaches in the archipelago, with white sands and curious granite boulders sticking up out the ground.

Our next stop is the Karimunjawa Islands, an archipelago of 27 isles surrounded by coral reefs. Snorkelling is almost obligatory here as the waters are so calm and clear and the reefs utterly spellbinding,

and a boardwalk leading through mangrove swamps is a fascinating habitat for kingfishers and wading birds. Lovina Beach on the island of Bali is our next port of call and it’s here you can really get your beach game going. It’s a low-key resort with few attractions beyond its dolphin monument and beautiful stretch of sand. Our voyage finishes in Benoa, in the south of Bali, where you might travel on to Lombok or other idyllic islands.

Indonesian Beaches & Northern Australia

Spectacular flower domes, sound and lights shows in the evening.



Karimun Jawa

Karimunjawa is an Indonesian archipelago in the Java Sea, it's known for Karimunjawa National Park, a marine conservation area with mangrove forests, beaches and coral reefs. Just take a swim in the turquoise waters or take a glass-bottom boat to witness the incredible marine wildlife.



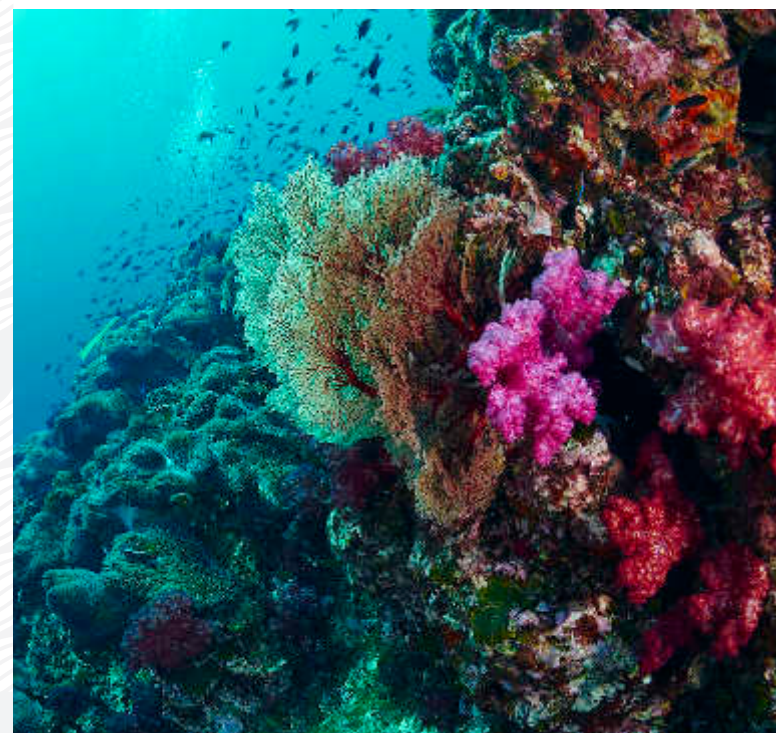
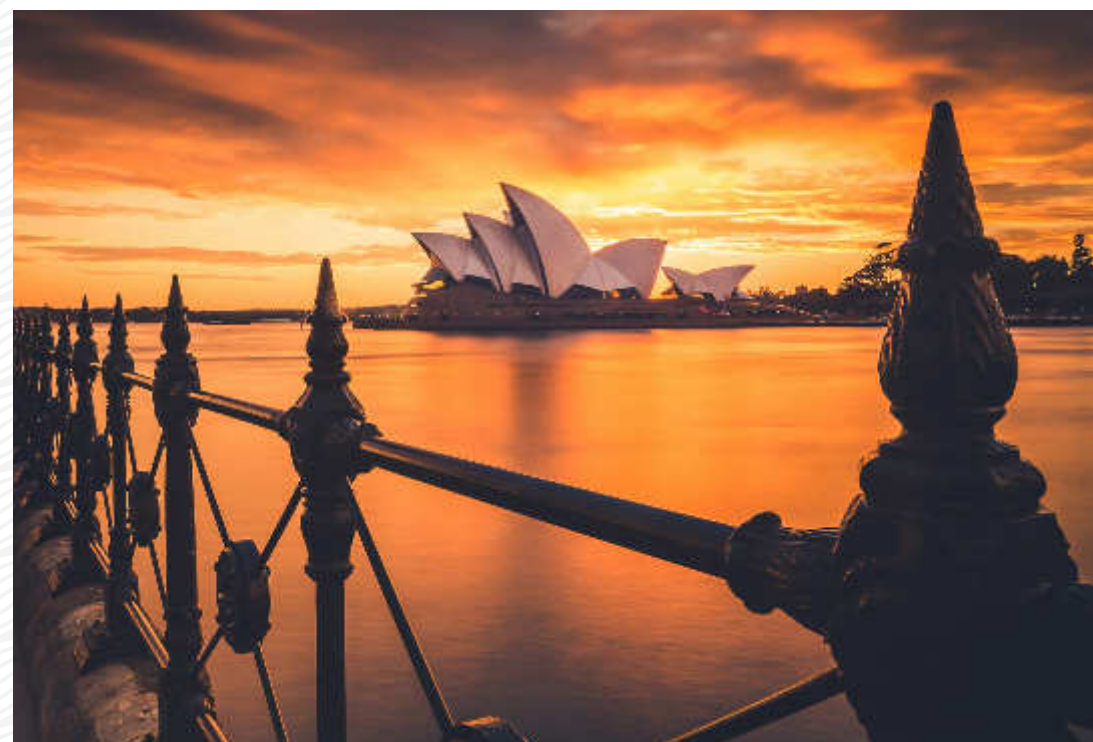
Lovina Beach

The walking trails are recommended on this car-free island if you want to spot koalas and kangaroos; or dive under the waves to experience the Great

Barrier Reef. Discover Brisbane's paddle steamers, botanic gardens and the Queensland Gallery of Modern Art before an unforgettable New Year's Eve watching the fireworks off Surfers Paradise, Gold Coast. After sailing along the Gold Coast on New Year's Day, we visit Trial bay and an overnight stay in Newcastle, before we end this voyage in vibrant Sydney.

South Australia and Tasmania Adventure

6 Jan, 2022 ~ 16 Nights ~ Calling at **Sydney**, Jarvis Bay, Batemans Bay, Eden, Darlington Bay, Hobart, Port Arthur, King Island, Melbourne, Victor Harbour, Penneshaw Kangaroo Island, **Adelaide**

From Adelaide, we'll sail to Kangaroo Island. Nature reserves cover one third of the island, so you'll have the chance to see wild koalas and rare birdlife here.



We'll sail to South Australia's Coffin Bay, famous for its secluded coastline and watersports – from sailing to diving – and make our way to the Head of Bight lookout, a great place for whale watching. Bremer Bay is known as a gateway to Fitzgerald River National Park, one of Australia's

biggest national parks where you can spot birds on Wellstead Estuary and explore the heritage-listed dwellings of Wellstead Homestead. We'll then sail further south to the city of Albany, home to museums, galleries and restaurants, before docking in Perth's quirky port city, Fremantle.

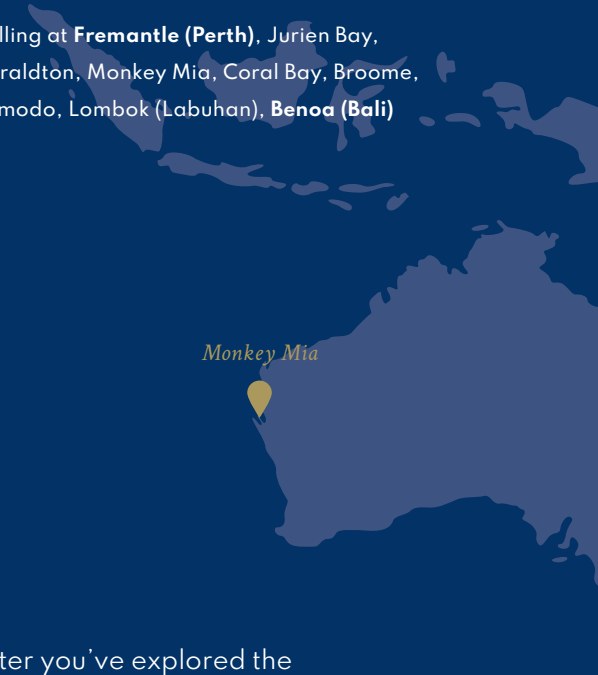

After you've explored the bohemian boutiques and seafood shacks of Fremantle, we'll board Golden Horizon and sail to little-explored fishing town Jurien Bay, known for its long sandy beaches and colourful reefs.

We'll visit Monkey Mia, known for the wild bottlenose dolphins that come up to the beach each day; and spend some time relaxing on the remote white sand beaches of Broome. As the wind flicks the sails, we'll head north of Australia to Komodo, home of the Komodo dragon, and cruise to the picture-perfect beaches edging Lombok, before ending this voyage in Bali.



Shore Experiences

Australia



Hobart, Tasmania

Hobart in Tasmania is set on the River Derwent estuary and is one of the world's greatest sailing cities and harbours. You can climb a mountain, view captivating modern art or eat fish and chips from one of the floating punts in the docks. There are markets to explore, history to uncover and the chance to discover Mount Field National Park, a eucalyptus rainforest with alpine moorland and captivating waterfalls and lakes. Don't miss the Tasmanian devils at Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary or join the Tassie Tasting Trail and savour the tastes of the local oysters.



Melbourne

There's so much to see and do in the beautiful city of Melbourne that we have scheduled an overnight stop here. You can journey along the Great Ocean Road and capture the astounding natural scenery through your camera lens. Take a city tour that ticks off St Patrick's Cathedral, Queen Victoria Market and the city's arcades and laneways. It's also a great chance to learn about Melbourne's quirks and history. The stunning Yarra Valley lies on the outskirts of the city and produces Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and sparkling wines.



Kangaroo Island

It's all about the wildlife on Kangaroo Island. In Flinders Chase National Park, take a walk through the bushland with a guide and keep a look-out for wallabies, echidnas and the elusive platypus. The island also has an incredible Food and Wine Trail, which links local farms that will welcome you in to try tasty wines, honey, cheese, yoghurt or products made from eucalyptus oil.

Albany

At the northern edge of Princess Royal Harbour lies Albany, Western Australia's oldest settlement. The harbour is part of King George Sound, keep watch for eagles and hawks above as we sail into the harbour. You can see wild kangaroos, try a damper – bread that was a staple of the early Australian settlers – and soak up the dramatic coastal scenery, with its rugged shorelines, sweeping white sand beaches and national park headland.

There's the chance to learn about Albany's infamous whaling past, see the station and step on board a whale chaser ship to be dwarfed by enormous whale skeletons. It's haunting but the mood is uplifted with presentations celebrating the beauty of whales. A trip here is also a great chance to learn about Albany's history in World War I at the National Anzac Centre, through both artefacts and interactive technology.



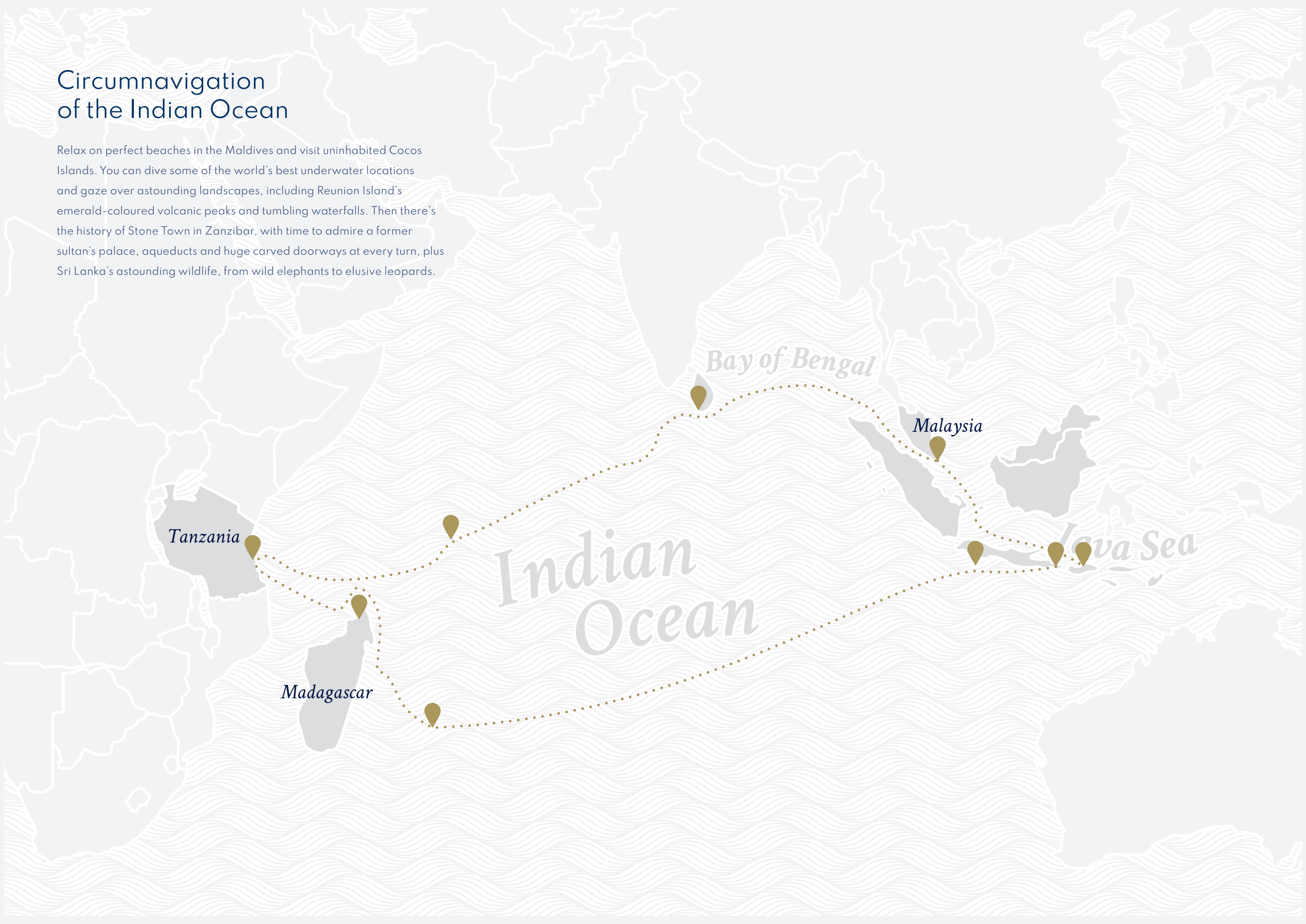
Komodo Island

North of Australia is Komodo Island, part of the Lesser Sunda chain of Indonesian islands. It's here that you'll find a rugged habitat of red volcanic hills, savannah and forests home to the Komodo dragon monitor lizard. Komodo National Park covers the entire region and is home to more than 4,000 dragons, helping to protect this unique species and its local eco-system. Ask us to book a tour with an expert guide, as visitor numbers are limited. The island is also famous for its pink sand beach, one of only seven in the world.



Circumnavigation of the Indian Ocean

Relax on perfect beaches in the Maldives and visit uninhabited Cocos Islands. You can dive some of the world's best underwater locations and gaze over astounding landscapes, including Reunion Island's emerald-coloured volcanic peaks and tumbling waterfalls. Then there's the history of Stone Town in Zanzibar, with time to admire a former sultan's palace, aqueducts and huge carved doorways at every turn, plus Sri Lanka's astounding wildlife, from wild elephants to elusive leopards.

You'll notice that life on Rodrigues takes on a slower pace – it's the perfect place for an authentic insight into local culture. You can also see beautiful historic buildings and giant tortoises. Our final stop is the popular holiday island of Mauritius, which combines stunning beaches with botanical gardens, tumbling waterfalls and incredible street food.



Mauritius, Madagascar and East Africa

Our final stop is Victoria on Mahé island, the capital of the Seychelles, buzzing with markets and local life.



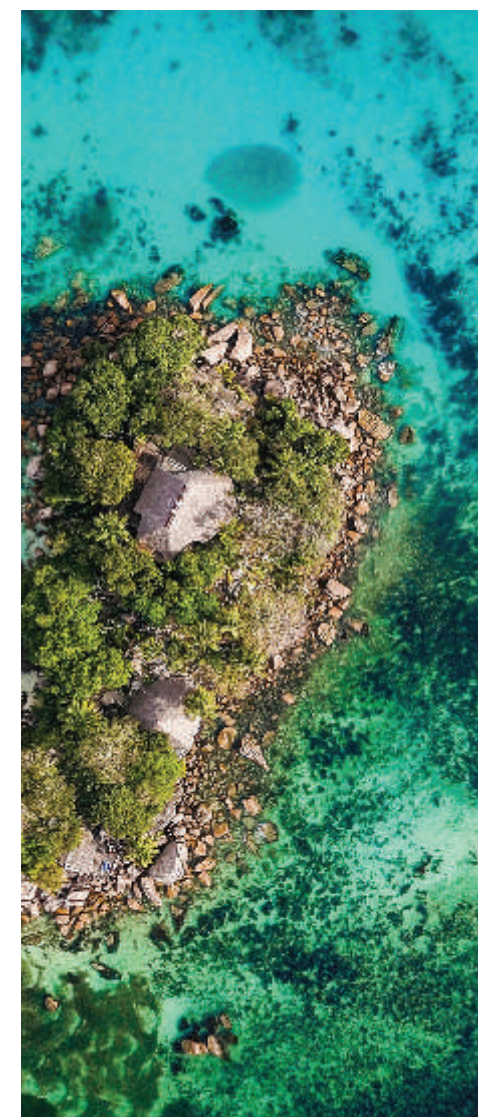

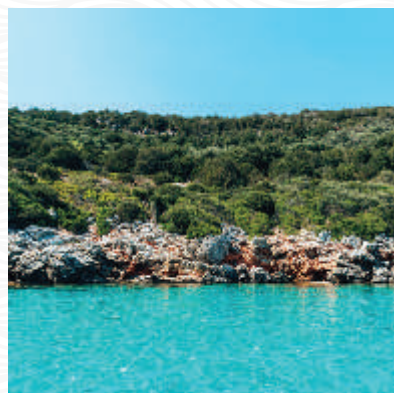
Antsiranana

The lively northern port city of Antsiranana (known as Diego Suarez until 1975) has wide streets lined with historic buildings, quality restaurants and a buzzing craft market, which has stunning views over the bay. It's a great departure point for Amber Mountain Park – one of the first places to receive national park protection in Madagascar – where you can hike through the rainforest in search of waterfalls, crater lakes, lemurs and other endemic flora and fauna.



Toamasina

The east coast port city of Toamasina has a fascinating old town with Creole houses built on stilts. Stroll along the wide avenues and coral beaches, and pause to look up at the towering banyan trees and crumbling mansion in Place Bien Aimé. A short cruise on the calm waters of the man-made Pangalanes Canal – the longest canal in the world – is a must. Visit local fishing villages, watch fishermen navigate the waters in traditional dugout canoes, and see the region's lush flora and fauna.



Comoro Islands

The remote Comoro Islands (or Comoros) are a group of mostly uninhabited islands that lie to the northwest of Madagascar. These volcanic islands offer a glorious step off the tourist trail. From the capital, Moroni, you can reach dazzling deserted beaches, visit ylang ylang production facilities and learn about local tribes and ancient cultures. For an unforgettable and otherworldly experience, go diving in the blue-green waters of the Mayotte Lagoon.

Zanzibar & Sri Lanka

Zanzibar

There are plenty of things to do on Tanzania's 'spice island'. Stone Town is a must-visit – it's the oldest part of the island's capital and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This coastal city is a rich mix of Arabian, Indian, African, Persian and Portuguese influences, with narrow winding streets, buzzing bazaars and weathered colonial buildings. Around the island you can also visit Jambiani Village to meet friendly local families, take a boat trip to Prison Island to see giant Aldabra tortoises and snorkel in clear blue waters



Christmas Island

This Australian territory south of Java is a nature lover's dream. 63% of the island has been given national park status and its location close to South-East Asia means the flora and fauna here is remarkably diverse. Exploring the island on a tour will give you the chance to see unique and endangered species that can't be found anywhere else in the world. Snorkel and dive in marine-rich waters with thriving coral reefs, go bird watching or try your hand at fishing. You can also learn about the island's unique red crab migration.



Cocos (Keeling) Islands

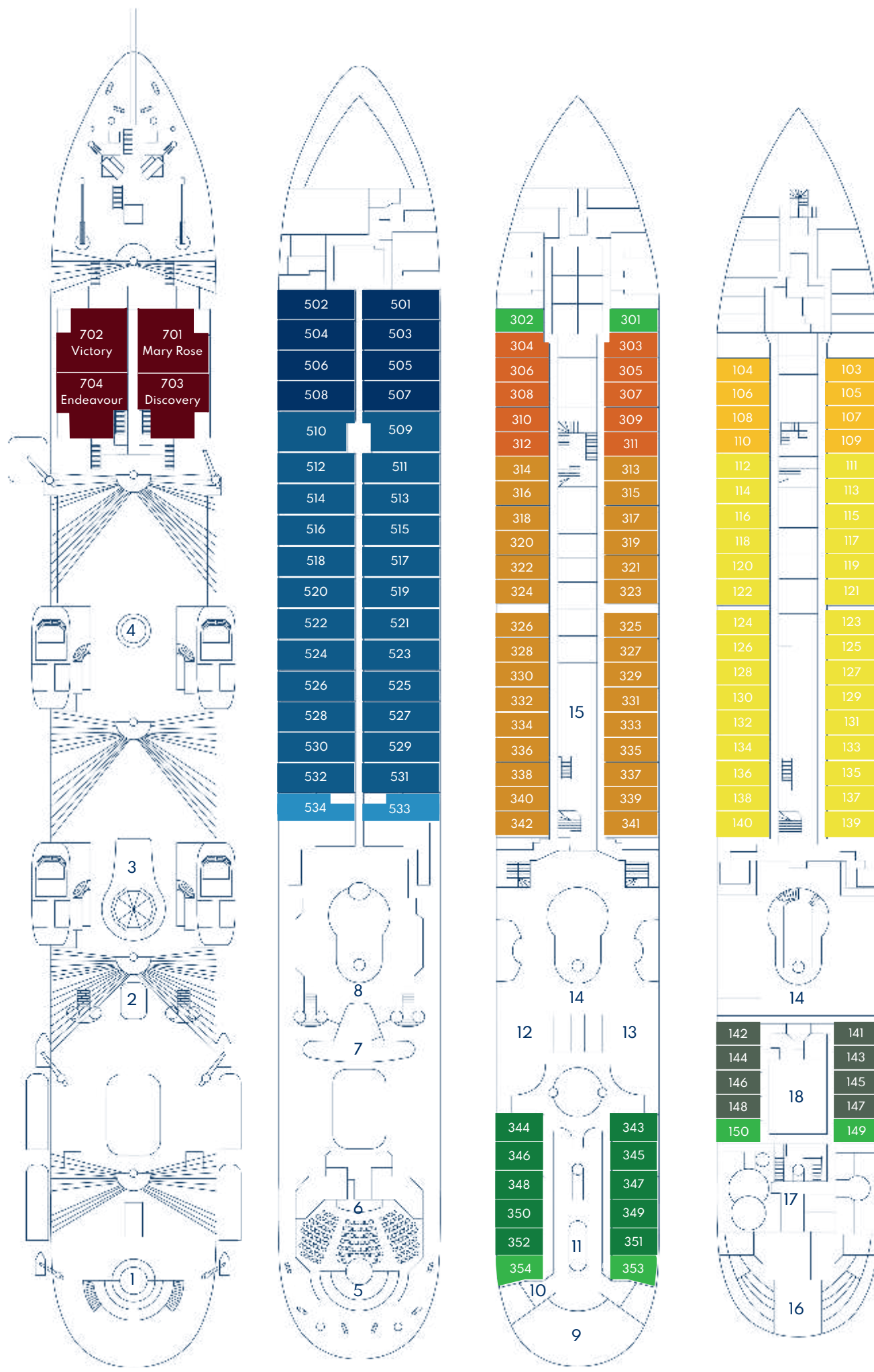
The remote Cocos is another Australian territory in the Indian Ocean. This idyllic archipelago is made up of 27 mostly uninhabited islands of swaying palms, frosted white sands and glistening lagoons. There's plenty to see and do: discover the bird colonies of Pulu Keeling National Park, dive to a shipwreck, visit the cultural Home Island Museum or try out the watersports on offer – from kayaking to stand-up paddle boarding – in the calm lagoon.

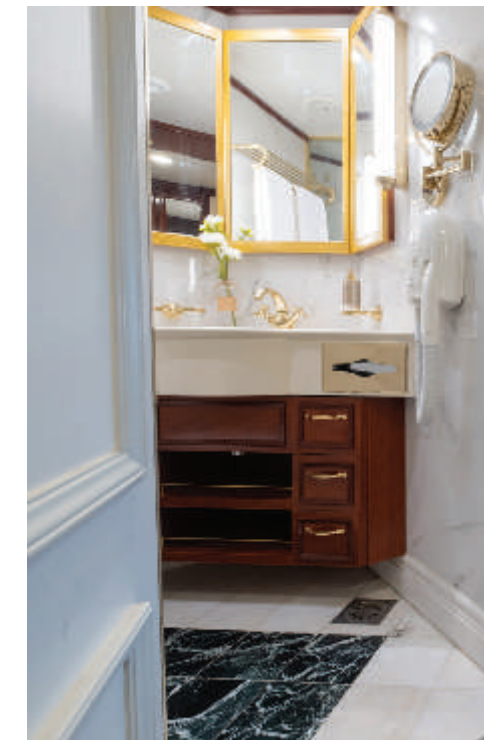
